NOTICE OF RACE & GENERAL CONDITIONS

- **ORGANIZING AUTHORITY / MANAGEMENT** - The organizing authority for this regatta is the Dana Point Yacht Club. The Dana Point Yacht Club Junior Race Committee will manage this regatta and shall have sole authority to interpret rules and conditions of the race, appoint a protest committee and to accept or reject the entry of any boat.
- **RULES** - The 2005-2008 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US Sailing and this Notice of Race shall govern all races except as any of these are changed by the Sailing Instructions. **This event will be held Saturday, September 6, 2008.**
- **ELIGIBILITY** - This regatta is open to all skippers of Naples Sabots and Lasers (Radial or full rig) that are age 18 and under.
- **ENTRIES** - Completed entries must be filed with DPYC before 0930 hours, Saturday, September 6, 2008. Mailed entry form should be sent to: Charity Regatta Chairman, DPYC, 24399 Dana Drive, Dana Point, CA 92629.
- **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS** – A skipper’s meeting will be held at DPYC on **Saturday, September 6, 2008** at 1100 hours. The first warning for racing will be at 1200 hours.
- **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** - Sailing Instructions and other important information will be issued Saturday at or before the skipper’s meeting. Written questions to the Race Chairperson may be filed before 1000 hours Saturday, September 6, 2008, and will be answered and posted 30 minutes after the skipper’s meeting or by 1130 hours which ever is later.
- **COURSES / STARTS** – The races will be held inside Dana Point Harbor, in the West Basin and in the waterways immediately around the island in accordance with Dana Point Inside Race Chart - 2008. The Sailing Instructions will include a schedule of races and courses. Five races are scheduled. If one or more races are finished, the regatta will be regarded as complete for trophy purposes. Yachts will race in classes as entered. Skippers will be notified by the Race Committee as to the class in which they will compete. Chase/Safety boats will be provided.
- **CHANGES TO RULES** – Rule 44.2 will be changed to make the alternative penalty one 360 turn, not two.
- **SCORING/TROPHIES – TROPHY PRESENTATION WILL TAKE PLACE ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 8TH AFTER THE BIG BOAT REGATTA .** The Low Point scoring system will apply except RRS Appendix A, as modified herein, no throw outs will apply. Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners of each class. **4 Wild Rivers Tickets, courtesy of Lexus of Mission Viejo, will be awarded to the first place winner in all 4 classes. Commemorative participant keepsakes will be provided to all race participants.**
- **FACILITIES** - All DPYC facilities will be available for use by skippers and guests. Upright dock carts will be made available to all skippers beginning at 0830 hours on Saturday. Due to construct of our marina facilities, standard dry rig dock carts are unusable in Dana Point. Please do not dry rig your boats in the parking lot. Competitors must wet rig their boats in the DPYC guest slip area. A rinse down area will be made available to all competitors after the regatta. Competitors are encouraged to place boats in the water before the Skipper’s Meeting, if possible.

I hereby indemnify and hold Dana Point Yacht Club (DPYC), their officers, directors, RC committee, Junior Sailing Program, and INSA harmless of any liability of any nature whatsoever for accident or injury to myself, my child, my guests and/or my boat, while racing or engaging in any activities related thereto; to the extent that such release does not discharge my insurance carrier under the provisions of the insurance policy (ies) covering my boat. I assume all risk of damage to property or injury to persons arising out of my participation in the race and all related activities.*
- 4. I further agree to notify DPYC immediately upon withdrawal from the race and not to sail in hazardous conflict with any other boat or commercial shipping vessel.*

2008 Junior Charity Regatta

Sailing Instructions

1. Rules - This regatta will be governed by the “rules” as defined in the 2005-2008 Racing Rules of

Sailing (RRS), by the Naples Sabot One-Design Class, or approved class per the PRO, and this Notice of Race except any of these that are changed by the Sailing Instructions.

2. Changes to Rules – Rule 44.2 will be changed to make the alternative penalty one (1) 360-degree turn, not two.

3. Notices to Competitors - Notices to competitors will be posted on the bulletin board in front of the

Dana Point Yacht Club entrance. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted no later than

1000 hours on the day it will take effect.

4. Schedule – A skipper’s meeting will be held at the Dana Point Yacht Club Junior Patio on September 6, 2008 at 1000 hours. The Charity Regatta is comprised of one to six races at the discretion of the PRO.

5. Classes – There will be four classes, Laser, Sabot A, Sabot B and Sabot C.

6. Marks and Courses – The marks and courses are described in the 2008 Dana Point Inside Racing

Course Chart. Courses to be sailed will be displayed by the race committee on a white board at the

South East corner of the Dana Point Yacht Club facility or as directed by the PRO.

7. Restrictions- “Baby Beach” adjacent to the Youth Group Facility, indicated by shoal buoys, is restricted.

8. Starting Line – The starting line(s) will be marked by a red flag at or near the cement pylon at the southeastern corner of the Dana Point Yacht Club property and the opposing cement pylon at the south west corner of the Dana Point Youth and Group facility or by a red flag at or near the Richard Henry Dana Statue in mid channel and a red flag staff directly off the breakwater across from the statue. Non starting boats shall stay clear of the starting line and may be penalized by the Race Committee if interfering with starting boats.

9. Finish Line – The finish line will be marked between the DPYC Oyster Bar balcony and the “G”

yellow anchorage marker in the West Basin with the exception of the windward leeward courses which will finish per the windward leeward course chart.

10. Checking In – If the race committee flies the “Come within Hail” flag, check-in is required prior to the warning signal.

11. Safety Equipment – All participants shall be required to wear lifejackets. All boats must comply with Naples Sabot Fleet safety requirements at all times.

12. Starting Sequence – The start of the race shall be a three (3) minute sequence signaled by horns as

follows (This modifies appendix Q) there will be a “rolling start” unless otherwise directed by the Race Committee:

12.1. Courtesy signal - 4 minutes - 4 short blasts

12.2. Warning - 3 minutes - 1 blast

12.3. Preparatory - 1 minute - 1 long blast

12.4. Start - 0 minutes - 1 blast

13. Flags - Flags may be used to signal postponement, abandonment or other signals prescribed in the

RRS for starting a race.

14. Recalls – Sail numbers will be hailed by the race committee for boats over early. Failure to do so will

not constitute grounds for redress. Boats over early that do not properly restart will be scored OCS for

that race.

14.1. Individual Recall - 1 blast and display the “X” flag

14.2. General Recall - 2 blasts and display the first substitute flag

15. Protests – Protests are strongly discouraged.

15.1. Protests must be filed within 30 minutes after the finish of the last boat. Protests will be heard within one hour of filing. There will be a \$25.00 protest fee assessed to the protester and contributed to the charity regatta fund (This modifies Rule 61.4.

16. Scoring/Trophies – The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply except as modified herein.

16.1. Competitors who fail to file an entry form as prescribed in the Notice of Race will not be scored.

16.2. Competing boats will be scored in accordance with RRS, Rule A9.

16.6. Prizes will be awarded to the top three finishers with the lowest total scores of each class.





16.7. Awards and presentation of the INSA Perpetual Trophy will be take place immediately following the last race in the Dana Point Yacht Club Junior Patio.

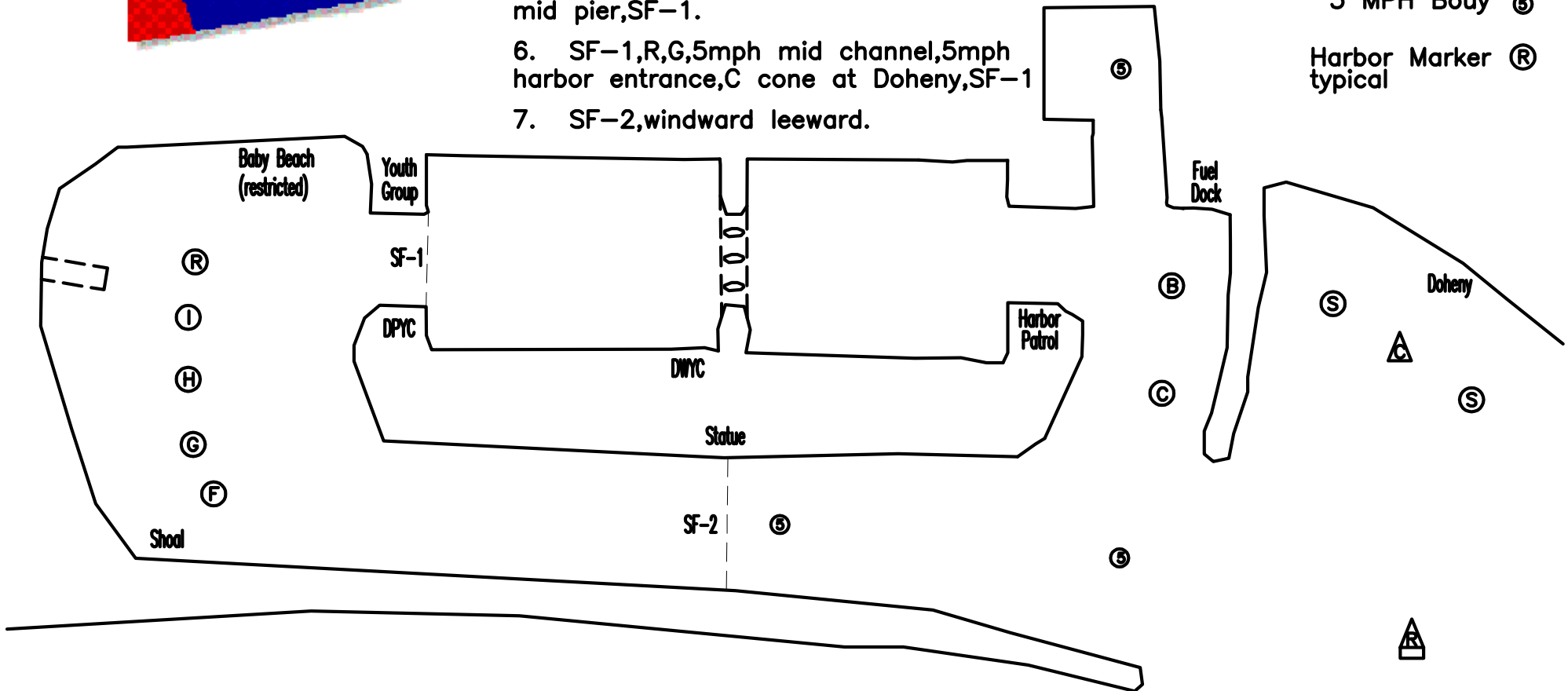
Dana Point Inside Race Chart - 2008
